Donkeys entered in the In Hand Showing Classes at this event are restricted to donkeys registered with the Donkey Breed Society, whose ancestry (where known) has been registered with and entered into the Pedigree Stud Book or any other DBS register appropriate to their status. The Show Drive class is affiliated to the British Driving Society.

BREAKING NEWS

Please read your schedule very carefully to note the changes and the rings, which we hope will give everyone the opportunity to enter in hand, driven and fun classes.

Equine Flu

The following rules are being implemented at Moreton Morrell Equine Centre, which is in line with advice from their vets.

All equines must be vaccinated for Equine Influenza, (within 12 months minimum) - it is also advised that they have a booster if they have not been vaccinated within 6 months. If your equine has been given a booster it must be at least 7 days clear before arriving at MM.

Equines starting new vaccination programs need to have had the first 2 vaccines within the recommended days apart & again vaccines must have been given 7 clear days before travelling to MM.

ALL EQUINES MUST ARRIVE WITH THEIR ORIGINAL PASSPORTS, NOT COPIES AND PASSPORTS MUST BE CHECKED BEFORE UNLOADING ANY ANIMAL.

Any equine arriving onsite without a passport, or one showing an out of date vaccine or showing a booster has been given in fewer days than 7 will be turned away.

Any equine turned away for non-compliance with these rules concerning equine flu will forfeit its entry and stable fees and the exhibitor will also forfeit any other monies paid in connection with the event.

Please see the British Equestrian Federations advise. If you have any concerns on the health of your equine do not travel it and contact your veterinary surgeon.

Notices

CATALOGUES

Catalogues must be pre-ordered to avoid wastage; there is space on the entry form to do this. Copies can be ordered from the Secretary over the weekend and sent to you afterwards at an additional cost of £2.00 to cover packing and postage. Pre-ordered price £3.00, delivery after the show £5.00.

ARRIVAL TIME

All entrants must be on site at least 90 minutes before their first scheduled class start time; in order to ensure there are no long gaps in the running order we may bring classes forward after having approached each of the entrants that would be affected by the change.

TROPHY COLLECTION

We try to be as accommodating as possible with trophy collections, according to the manpower we have available, once again we have imposed cut off times. It will not be possible to collect any trophies, rosettes or other awards after 14:00 on Sunday, 18th August 2019.

Venue

STABLES

Once again, on the grounds of welfare for your donkey the committee have decided that they would prefer donkeys staying on site to be stabled but accept that other arrangements may be made. The stables, which will hold a maximum of 3 donkeys, are purpose built in an American Barn arrangement.

Please note that Stallions and entire Colts should be stabled singly.

Stables will be issued on a first come first served basis and they will only be allocated on receipt of a completed entry. Mr Rob Sims will be stable manager, ably assisted by Mrs Carole Travell as necessary.

ON SITE ACCOMMODATION

We have a limited number of rooms available to us on a room only basis; all are single rooms, some of which will have en-suite facilities however depending on how many rooms we require others maybe non en-suite. The charges are as shown on the accommodation schedule. There is also limited grass available for overnight camping, be it in your own tent, caravan or lorry; charges are shown on the fees sheet. The site is compact and there are a variety of surfaces to be traversed; we will make what accommodations we can for disabled access and viewing but we are not permitted to make any structural alterations to the site and there may be some restrictions placed on vehicular proximity to the facilities, which would be imposed for the safety of all people and animals on the site.

OTHER INFORMATION

Late Entries

Late entries will continue again this year, to reach the Secretary between the 29th July and 8th August 2019 and on the day for the Saturday Classes provided the maximum numbers that can be accommodated have not been reached. The entry fee will however be 50% more than that for entry pre-10th July 2019. Additionally, the donkeys/mules concerned may not feature in the catalogue. Late entries must be made on the late entry form that accompanies this schedule and accompanied by a cheque for the appropriate fee (or paid electronically). Entries made on the day must be made as follows:

Junior Classes - by 09:00 on Saturday 17th August 2019 to the Secretary together with the appropriate fee. Provided the maximum numbers have not been reached a ticket will be issued that will ensure the stewards allow entry to the ring.

Driving Classes - by 08:30 on Saturday 17th August 2019 to the Chief Driving Steward together with the appropriate fee. Provided the maximum numbers have not been reached a ticket will be issued that will ensure the stewards allow entry to the ring.

Emailing of Entry Forms and Electronic Payment of Entry Fees

Completed entry forms may be scanned and emailed to the Show Secretary - donkeybreedsocietytreasurer@gmail.com. Anyone wishing to make their entry in this manner must pay their entry fees electronically and submit a copy of the payment advice. Receipt of the funds will be checked, and a response sent as soon as possible confirming receipt of the entry or requesting further information as necessary.

If you are unable to scan completed entry forms but still wish to pay electronically please feel free to do so and ensure you enclose a copy of the payment advice along with your entry forms.

Protective Headwear

Please note the general rules relating to protective headwear relating to ridden and driving classes. It is also strongly recommended that Junior members wear a hat of the same standard when handling any donkey/mule or entering any in hand or fun class.

ADDITIONAL AWARDS

BEST RESCUE DONKEY AWARD

There will be an award for the 'best' rescue gelding, filly or mare, owned by a registered charity and living in a foster home, as judged by the Show Director. The foster carer must be a fully paid up member of the Donkey Breed Society. Such donkeys are eligible to take part in all classes.

BEST TRADITIONAL REIN HANDLING

This will be the Driving Judges choice of the best demonstration of traditional rein handling (i.e. coachman style) in classes leading up to the Driving Championship.

DINKY RUGS CUP - for fun loving donkeys

The Dinky Rugs Cup will be awarded to the donkey with the highest number of points in the following classes: SF1 - SF2 - SF5 - SF8 - SF9 - SF11 - SF20. There will be 6 points for first place down to 1 point for sixth place.

TEAM CHALLENGE

Teams of 3 donkeys, one of whom may (not must) have been handled by a junior in a junior class; £8.00 per team. Points will be awarded from 6 for first place down to 1 for sixth place in the following classes: J30 to J35 + SF1 - SF2 - SF5 - SF8 - SF9 - SF11 - SF20 - SF25 - SF26 - SF36. Rosettes to each team member.

PROGENY POINTS AWARDS

Points are awarded to the sire / dam where eligible, and the highest scoring sire will win the Stallion Progeny Points Award, while the highest scoring dam will win the Mare Progeny Points Award. Points will be awarded in the In Hand classes at this show and from pre-qualified donkeys who are not forward at this show. The parent of the pre-qualified progeny will be awarded 6 points for each pre-qualified donkey, but those donkeys will not be eligible for in hand class points. For non- pre-qualified donkeys who enter the In Hand Classes the following are points are awarded to the parents of the progeny as follows; 6 for 1st, 5 for 2nd, 4 for 3rd, 5 for 4th 2 for 5th and 1 for 6th. In addition, there will be 4 points for each parent of the Individual Champions and a further 2 points for the parents of the Reserve Champions. There are 4 points for each parent of the DBS British Supreme Champion and 2 points for the parents of the DBS British Reserve Champion. Those donkeys registered in the Stud Book as well as those entered in other appropriate DBS registers are eligible for the awards. The winning mare and stallion must be owned on the date of the show by a fully paid up member of the society. If the winning donkey(s) are deceased the award will still be made. If the owner(s) of the winning donkey(s) are deceased the Society shall retain the trophy(s) for that year. As the results cannot be ascertained until after the show the trophies will be presented at the Society Annual General Meeting. In the event of a tie all winners will hold the trophy(s) for equal periods.

THE TRINETTE HINDLE AWARD

This will be presented to the best turned out handler from all entries at the Show. As usual the Judges are not named.

STUBBINGS TROPHY

Points will be awarded to entrants with any disability, driving a suitable vehicle or a vehicle purpose built to carry a wheelchair. The vehicle is to be driven in the traditional English style or the driver is to use reins with any necessary adaptations. The whip may be carried by an able-bodied companion. The points will be awarded as follows for each position in each class - 6 for 1st, 5 for 2nd, 4 for 3rd, 3 for 4th, 2 for 5th and 1 for 6th. The trophy will be awarded to the entrant with the highest total score. In the event of a tie the trophy will be shared on a time basis. Eligible entrants must mark their entry forms with a large "D" in the top right-hand corner.

CLEEVE DRIVING PERFORMANCE TROPHY

Points will be awarded to entrants in the Dressage (Classes D55 and D56) and Obstacle Driving (Classes SF34 and SF35) and they must enter the Show Drive (Class D57). The donkey must be driven by the same Whip in each class. There will be 1 point for 1st, 2 for 2nd et seq. with the trophy being awarded to the entrant with the lowest total score. In the event of a tie the trophy will be shared on a time basis.

PHOTOGRAPHY COMPETITION - FREE TO ENTER

Just submit a portfolio of up to 6 pictures, taken at the 2019 show, to depict the 'fun' side of the weekend. The winner will be announced at the Society AGM and a rosette awarded. It is a condition

of entry that all photographs entered are the property of the person making the entry, who also gives permission for these photos to be used for any DBS display or publication purposes. Entries to be made to the Show Secretary, by 30th September following the show.

Show Schedule Information

The organisers reserve the right to amalgamate or split classes as appropriate based on the entries received by 10th July 2019.

All pre-qualified in hand championship donkeys must enter their appropriate class; they do not have to be forward, but the entrant must declare whether they will be forward or not when making the entry.

Classes are only open to donkeys unless otherwise specified.

Please note that the words 'to follow' in the timetable mean 'ready and waiting in plenty of time'. Where an exhibitor in the driving class needs to collect another turnout, they must make the ring steward aware of this and an agreed waiting time obtained.

Please ensure that you read and abide by all rules as detailed at the back of this schedule.

Donkey Ages

Like all equines donkeys and mules have an official birthday on 01 January each year so that they are deemed to be a yearling on the 1st January immediate, following their birth and a 2-year-old on the following 1st January and so on. SUNDAY 18TH AUGUST - RINGS ONE AND TWO COMBINED

Donkey Breed Society In Hand Championships

Judges - The two in hand judges together with the Junior's judge will form the judging panel for the Individual and Supreme Championships.

Procedure - Each class shall comprise the qualifying donkey from the morning classes, together with pre-qualified donkeys in accordance with the rules above. Donkeys will enter the ring in accordance with the instructions from the ring steward and parade around the ring where they may be asked to perform a trot. The Donkeys will then be individually called from the holding area by the ring steward. Each donkey will be assessed by each of the three judges at stand and as they are walked and trotted away. Marks will be awarded as below. The Champion and Reserve will be awarded to the donkeys with the highest and next highest average total marks.

Scoring in the individual Championships - The Judges will independently without conferring award marks between 10 and 20 to each donkey for Confirmation, Type, and Movement. In the event of a tie the highest conformation mark will decide which donkey is champion, if there is still a tie the movement mark will be considered, if there is still a tie at this stage the judges will be asked again to place the tied donkeys in position according to their preference with the most preferred donkey being awarded the Championship.

Scoring in the Young-stock and Supreme Championships - The Individual Champions and their Reserves will enter the ring in accordance with the instructions provided by the Ring Steward and parade around the ring where they may be asked to perform a trot. The Champions will then line up with Reserves behind them. The champion donkeys may be asked to perform individual routines. The Judges will independently without conferring award places to the champion donkeys (the front row) in the Youngstock Championship 1st to 3rd and in the Supreme Championship 1st to 4th (1 point for first, 2 points for second and so on) the winner being the donkey with the lowest total placing points and therefore awarded the championship. In the event of a tie the judges would be asked to nominate which of the donkeys involved in the tie they prefer as the winner. The Reserve to the winning Youngstock/Supreme Champion will step forward and join the front line of donkeys and then be assessed against the other Champions and once again positions awarded. The donkey with the lowest overall placing points will be awarded the Reserve Championship. In the event of a tie the Judges would be asked to nominate which of the donkeys involved they prefer.

All donkeys qualifying for the In Hand Championship will be awarded a qualifying rosette before entering the ring for the above championships. All Championship winners will be presented with a sash of honour and a winner's rosette. All Reserve Champions will be presented with a reserve's rosette.



GENERAL RULES

1. All owners and exhibitors of donkeys must be fully paid up members of The Donkey Breed Society.
2. The exhibitor will always be held responsible for the conduct of both themselves and their representatives, and rude or unacceptable behaviour towards any Donkey or Mule, a Steward or a Judge will be penalised in accordance with the committee's wishes.
3. No person may deliberately enter or show a donkey/mule under a judge who is known to have owned, bred, leased, sold produced prepared or shown that donkey/mule. No donkey/mule should be entered or shown under a judge who currently owns or leases the sire of that animal or owned or leased the sire at the time of covering. The breeder is the mare owner. No donkey/mule may be shown under a judge who has previously exhibited on behalf of the owner in the current season.
4. Every exhibit must have been resident in the UK for 3 months prior to the event and no nominated or substitute entries will be permitted except for physically handicapped drivers registered in Riding for the Disabled Association's Group. In the event of a donkey being sold between the time of entry and the date of the show the entry will be deemed to be owned by the person who submitted the entry; any trophy awarded will be the responsibility of the person. In the event of the death of an exhibitor between the date of entry and the date of the show the legal representative of the deceased will be deemed to be the exhibitor.
5. Leased donkeys must be entered by the lessee who must have completed a Leasing Agreement form and lodged such with the Society Stud Book Registrar, and the Passport Administrator must be informed for the National Database, in accordance with the Passport Act 1998. The lessee shall then be responsible for signing the declarations on the Statement of Entry Form.
6. All donkey foals must have their entry into the appropriate DBS Register applied for and acknowledged by the Stud Book Registrar before the close of entries. Foals under six months old must be accompanied by their dams. Orphan foals under three months of age are not eligible for entry. No foal under 6 weeks of age is permitted to be present on the show ground.
7. No donkeys/mules (i.e. show, companion or display donkeys/mules) will be admitted on site unless they are accompanied by an equine passport and a signed certificate of health taken from a Statement of Entry document and lodged with the Honorary Show Secretary. The production of a Vaccination certificate is not mandatory but is highly recommended and should vaccination become mandatory at the venue prior to the show there can be no refund of entry or stabling fees to exhibitors who cannot produce a valid certificate.
8. Any donkey/mule coughing or showing signs of an infectious disease must be isolated immediately pending a veterinary examination. The decision of a Veterinary Surgeon on this or any other referral will be binding. Fees incurred will be the sole responsibility of the owner.
9. No exhibit may enter the class late or be taken from the ring without permission of the judge through the ring steward.
10. No unauthorised person will be permitted to enter any show ring during the judging.
11. If any donkey/mule or handler behaves in a dangerous or inappropriate manner they will be asked to leave the ring immediately.
12. All entire male donkeys/mules, yearlings and over, must be dressed in a bridle and bit, with the leading rein/driving reins correctly attached to the bit, for all their classes. They must not be left tied outside a stable/lorry etc unless they are attended by a competent adult at all times. Colts / stallions must not be tied in any thoroughfare or area where other animals and people not directly associated with the donkey/mule need to pass. When stabled (or kept on a lorry/trailer) they must wear a leather or safety head collar at all times.
13. No colts or stallions may be entered for any junior class.
14. A recognised bitless bridle may be used in all ridden / driven classes unless an entire male donkey/mule is being exhibited, in which case rule 12 applies. Blinkers are NOT mandatory in long rein and driven classes.
15. All driven and ridden donkeys/mules must be 4 years old or over.
16. All long-reined donkeys/mules must be 3 years or older.
17. No whips over 30" or 762mm in length overall will be permitted in any class other than long-reining and driving.
18. All riders must wear a hard hat in the correct manner which conforms to the current BSI standards and carries the BSI kite mark and in ridden classes a correctly fitted saddle and bridle must be fitted

19. Riders in ridden class must comply with the following criteria:
 - i. Donkeys /Mules up to 10.2hh-not over 8stone/50.80Kg or 48in/121.90cm
 - ii. Donkeys/Mules 10.2hh to 11.0hh - not over 8stone/50.80Kg or 54in/137.20cm
 - iii. Donkeys/Mules 11,0hh to 12.0hh - not over 9 stone/57.15Kg or 60 in/152.40cm
 - iv. Donkeys/Mules 12.0hh to 14.0hh - not over 10stone/63.50Kg or 66 in/167.50cm Donkeys/Mules over 14.0hh - riders to be of a suitable weight, Judges decision is final.
20. No unauthorised feeding of donkeys/mules will be allowed.
21. Noise should be kept to a minimum at all times especially at night.
22. All official show signage, or signs erected by the venue, must be strictly adhered to.
23. Dogs to remain in the parking area and kept on leads at all times, please clear up their mess.
24. The stewards will take responsibility for clearing any droppings in the rings, but owner/exhibitors must clear up any droppings made by their animal in any other area of the site.
25. The committee acting on behalf of the DBS council reserves the right to accept or reject any entry, to cancel, or postpone the show, to cancel, divide or amalgamate classes, to change classes from one ring to another, to change judges from one class to another, or appoint additional or substitute judges without due warning or without explanation. The Committee will adhere as closely as possible to the final published timetable and no class will commence earlier than stated.
26. All Trophies are challenge trophies and remain the property of the DBS. All trophies must be returned to any member of the show committee by the fifteenth of July each year or with permission can be handed in at the show secretary's office (for which a receipt must be obtained, if you don't obtain a receipt you remain liable for that trophy). In the event that theses trophies are not available for presentation the previous holders are personally responsible for arranging delivery to the current year winners and the committee reserves the right to reject any future entries from winners who did not return trophies. All reasonable precaution must be taken to prevent loss or damage to the trophies. Notice of loss or damage must be reported to the Honorary Show Secretary or Honorary Show Treasurer within 21 days. All trophies must be engraved in the style already set.
27. Neither the Society nor the Committee shall be responsible for any injury, fatal or otherwise, loss or damage, however caused, that may occur to any exhibitor or potential exhibitor their appointed representative, any spectator, servant or any other person, or their property, donkey or other animal. Every exhibitor shall on entry be deemed to indemnify and hold harmless the Society and the Committee from and against all actions and suits, expenses and claims on account thereof.
28. Any exhibitor or representative wishing to make a protest regarding a class must lodge an application in writing to the Show Secretary office together with twenty pounds within fifteen minutes of the completion of judging of the class, unless it is a driving class, in which case the protest must be made within one hour. If on investigation the protest is not upheld the sum deposited shall be forfeited to the funds of the Society. A notice of protest posted at the show office shall be deemed to be sufficient notice to all interested parties, who must attend the protest committee at such time and place notified when the objection will be investigated. The Protest Committee reserves the right to refer any objection to any authority or organisation to adjudicate thereon in whole or in part, the decision of the Protest Committee will be final. The Protest Committee will comprise the Chairman of the Society, the Honorary Show Secretary the Honorary Chief Steward, and if required the appropriate Judge's ring steward.
29. Any infringement of these or any other prescribed rules or conditions will if so ordered by the committee subject the exhibitor, to the forfeiture of any award to which they may otherwise be entitled, or such other penalty as determined by the committee.

Additional Rules and Procedures for Driving Classes

1. Entrants may give the names of 2 drivers on their entry forms, each of whom must be a fully paid up, current member of the DBS.
2. The Judges and or Chief Steward have the authority to remove any donkey/mule deemed to be unfit from any class.
3. The same turnout must be used for all British Supreme Driving qualifying classes however an exercise vehicle may be used instead of the trade vehicle for the show drive and dressage class.

4. The private driving class will be judged in accordance with British Driving Society standards.
5. No vehicle entered in the private driving class can enter the exercise class.
6. Entries in the trade class must not be driven from the ground.
7. In the exercise vehicle class, providing the vehicle and harness are clean safe and fit correctly, they will not be taken into consideration in the judging.
8. In the novice section of dressage, entrants are permitted a caller who must be used for the whole test. The entrant provides the caller and ensures they are on time. The use of a caller will result in a penalty of 15 points, which will be deducted from the test total.
9. Best Whip Class the vehicle and harness, providing they are safe, will not be taken into account in the judging. Judging will be based entirely on the whips ability to drive correctly in the traditional English manner.
10. Junior Whips must have a competent adult present with them at all times, the adult may be in the vehicle or on foot.
11. A stallion may be driven by a junior whip only when accompanied by an experienced adult whip who must be present in the vehicle at all times.
12. Multiple turnouts (e.g. pairs, tandems, teams etc.) can enter an extra animal, but the names of animals for the turnouts must be declared to the Steward before the class is entered.

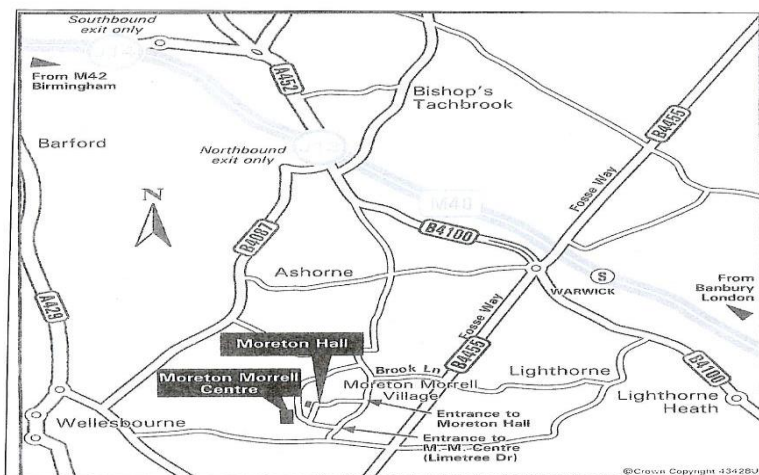
