What would motivate a thirty-year-old woman to set out alone on a walking tour in 1923?

Eve Brackenbury left a surprisingly intimate diary, written as she travelled through England and Scotland with Hotep, her pack donkey.

In crossing the moors with Hotep, walking for hours in appalling weather and fending off threatening or unwanted attention, Eve showed herself to be a spirited, brave and resourceful person.

"During the first part of the walk the scenery was magnificent but rather frightening. The wind howled through the telegraph wires overhead, making a weird uncanny lament as we climbed higher and higher. For many miles there was no sign of human habitation, no sheep, no birds — we seemed to be the only living creatures in a wilderness of stern grey boulders and wind-flattened grass."

Eve, a post-WWI Bohemian young woman, captures the reader with her quirky interests, her spark of wickedness and inclination to shock people, her very matter-of-fact approach to men and sex, and the courage and curiosity with which she explores personal boundaries and rises to the challenge of new, and sometimes risky, experiences.
