Ongoing Projects:

A Fab Farrier's Award – we are delighted to report that this scheme, that originated in the Northern Region, has now been extended throughout the DBS in the UK. We have six farriers in our own region that have been presented with the Award, in recognition of their care of our donkeys. Fab Farriers must meet stringent criteria. They are nominated by a grateful donkey owner/guardian. All successful farriers are congratulated and profiled in the BFBA trade magazine, *Forge*. It is hoped that future farriers receiving the Award will let non-DBS clients know about the DBS in the Northern Region, through the flyers that will be given to them, along with their certificates.

War Horse Memorial Organisation – many members in the Region have supported our National partnership with the War Horse Memorial Organisation. We have promoted the purple poppy campaign by acquiring knitted and enamel badges and some of our members took part in the Walk for War Horse.

Online presence – Facebook has been a great source of information and camaraderie for some of our members. The Northern Region has a Facebook page and members frequently share information and news.
