Fortunately he passed away peacefully at home with his beloved pets at his side. Until his disabilities got progressively worse, Adrian would often accompany us to donkey shows, London New Years' Parade etc and always enjoyed the company of other members etc

On the brighter side, we did manage to attend two churches on Psalm Sunday with the help from family. We were only able to take 2 donkeys as Andrew was able to tow the trailer with his car as myself and my car were unavailable. All went very well, particularly as the re-enactment was a new arrangement from previous years and Rosie took everything in her stride especially as she was not used to attending this service as she usually attends the Spire Church Palm Sunday Service with Andrew and she had not been out anywhere since the pandemic.
