<u>New East Essex Area Rep - An intro from Jude –</u>

A little about me - I'm relatively new to donkey ownership but I've been obsessed with donkeys since I was little. I owned an ex race horse called Risky from 1995 until 2020, when he died, aged 30. He was a crazy nut bar who was absolutely petrified of donkeys! He didn't need to even see a donkey, the bray alone would send him flat out in the opposite direction. So there was no way I could entertain the idea of owning or adopting a donkey (x2!)

When I lost Risky in August 2020 I knew I had to have a new purpose, after a lifetime of early mornings, mucking out before work, mud, finding horses by torch light after work, there was no way I could suddenly lie in!

Having left teaching after 25 years, due to injuries and endless complications, I wanted to combine my two passions, teaching and donkeys.

I wanted to learn as much as possible about donkey ownership, so I spent a week volunteering at Miller's Ark in Hook, and looked after 40+, miniature donkey, mums and babies. I enjoyed it so much I stayed for a second week!! It was then the November lockdown, so to help the farm I took home 8 mums and babies and fostered them for 4 months. The babies were 3 months old and were due to be weaned and go to their new homes when they turned 6 months and the mums returned to the farm. Definitely thrown in at the deep end! I ended up with two minis, Thumbelina and Tinkerbell! Aged 2 and 3, there is never a dull moment!!

I joined the DBS and the Facebook pages and found a mass of information and a group of people who were incredibly knowledgeable and happy to help, not always the case in the equine world! Jane Brind found me a donkey friendly farrier after my own farrier exclaimed 'he didn't do donkeys!' Annette Staverley has shared her boundless donkey knowledge and filled me with confidence at 'Donkey Thursdays'! Carole Travell's help and support at shows, where I literally knew nothing. These are just a few examples of the community spirit that is the DBS.

Their support is why I wanted to help within the DBS and become the area rep!

For the past 3 years I have been owned by 2 donkeys, a small 8 y.o. grey gelding, Dante and a 3 y.o. chestnut filly, Gift. We try to keep active, I'm learning to drive Dante and both donkeys completed the 100 mile walking challenge last year.

I compile the Bray Talk Donkey In Art articles, distribute the Ear Ear Newsletter and share Minute taking at meetings. I try and run a biennial event (23rd April this year) for those wishing to walk, long-rein, ride or drive their donkeys through the unique Cambridgeshire fens.

In addition to the pleasure of owning two affectionate and humorous donkeys, I've enjoyed joining the DBS, meeting friendly, like-minded people, learning new skills and taking part in various activities. Additionally, I feel supported within an experienced group environment.
