# **Purple poppies**

As you should be aware, the Donkey Breed Society is in partnership with War Horse Memorial (the 'purple poppy people'). They raise funds through donations in exchange for enamel lapel badge purple poppies, to be worn in memory of animals that have lost their lives or suffered during war. Several members take a collecting box and some poppies, and pop them out at feed merchants, local shops etc. The public make donations and take a poppy. We retain 50% of donations and the remainder goes back to War Horse who then use it to support various charities such as World Horse Welfare, The Brooke – and us!
