ADDERS! (be aware, and know what to do if you, your dog or donkey are bitten) - Jude Pearce

Adders are the only poisonous snake found in the UK.

On Mersea Island, in Essex, we have the highest concentration of Adders in the UK.

They are a protected species and it is a criminal offence to intentionally kill or injure an Adder.

They very rarely bite but it's good to know what to do if it happens to you, your donkey or your dog.

Most of the time adders stay in the long grass so it's easy to assume they're not there. In the hotter months, (if we have any sunshine) you will see them in the open basking in the sun.



Identifying if your donkey has been bitten by an Adder.

Do not approach or try and move the adder, find an alternative route! Adder bites occur when the snake is trodden on by accident or approached by an inquisitive muzzle/nose.

If you suspect your donkey has been bitten by an adder do the following:

- 1) CALL YOUR VET IMMEDIATELY and explain the full details of the bite, refer to your passport for your donkeys last tetanus injection.
- 2) Try and keep your donkey still. The less they move the less toxin he'll absorb.
- 3) Do not ice the wound as this may irritate it.
- 4) Do not try and cut out the wound, this will cause the toxins to spread.
- 5) Keep Calm and don't panic, your donkey will pick up on your mood.

If you don't see the bite occur and you find your donkey unwell in the field, look for the following symptoms:

- 1) A wobbly gait and general weakness.
- 2) Laboured breathing
- 3) Colic signs: sweating, pawing, rolling
- 4) Swollen muzzle/leg.
- 5) Dilated pupils.

As we know donkeys are stoic creatures and can hide their pain, so look for any changes your donkey's behaviour. If it has been bitten there will two obvious puncture wounds.

Remember snake bites are very rare in the UK but it doesn't hurt to be prepared for the unexpected.

- If it is your own field or you're out on a walk, know your 'what3words' location. Emergency services and your vet can pinpoint your location from this.
- It's a good idea if you take a photo of the vaccination page in your donkey's passport with your phone, then you have the details on hand for when the vet arrives.
- With any accident or injury always remember to remain calm and seek professional advice.



CAUTION

ADDERS ARE FOUND THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY PARK.

You may wish to keep your dog on a lead and tell your children not to play in the long grass areas.
