The organisers reserve the right to amalgamate or split classes as appropriate based on the entries received by 16th June 2025. Donkeys qualifying at events between that date and 31 July 2025 are still eligible to submit entries, but no later than noon on 04 August 2025.

Please note that rings commence at 09:30 am, except for the Cones & Obstacles classes, which will commence at 10:30 am. All classes will automatically follow on from the previous one, so exhibitors are expected to be ready and waiting in plenty of time. Where an exhibitor in the driving class needs to collect another turnout, they must make the ring steward aware of this, and an agreed waiting time obtained.

RING THREE - Classes commence at 09:30 am

Pleasure Driving - aimed at non-traditional showing. Exhibitors maybe asked to negotiate a road junction as part of the individual show. Whips and grooms must be wearing a hat and gloves and carrying a whip, however, show wear need not be worn.

Precision and Paces - a short test will be driven individually with emphasis on precision and accuracy of movements and the way of going for the donkey.

DRIVING CHAMPIONSHIPS

- Concours D'Elegance This is judged entirely on presentation and the ability to demonstrate a pleasing picture from those donkey turnouts entered at the Show. All drivers are automatically entered for the award.
- C12 Driven Novice Award The Claygate Novice Driving Trophy is awarded to the most successful novice whip, in the opinion of the judge, from those receiving Novice Rosettes in the Open driving (D52 to D54) and The Precision and Paces classes (D65A to D65C)
 - **Supreme Driving Championship** The eligible entrants must have completed in an open driving class and one of the Precision and Paces classes.
- C13 This will be the two highest placed turnouts from each open driving section and the two highest placed turnouts from each section of the Precision and Paces classes

Commencing at 10:30 am

Cones/Obstacles - a series of cones and obstacles to be negotiated without knocking balls off. This will be timed. It is being run in parallel with the driving ring.

Class D66 - Driven Class D67 - Long reined

NOTICES

Awards. Any one with an award from last year should return it to Caroline Tween, preferably before the event. Her contact numbers are 01277 514046 or 07763 492845

Day Members. Any day member will not be eligible for an award that goes to the individual as opposed to the donkey. This includes, but is not limited to: Young Handler, Young Rider, Newcomer, Best Whip, and the Trinette Hindle Award.

SOCIETY RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW

All donkeys must have passports. Those entered in the In-hand breed classes will need either a DBS passport or one over stamped by the DBS.

All riders, handlers, whips and grooms must be members of the DBS. Day memberships are available at a cost of £5 for any 'helpers on the day'. Please see the Fees section of the Declaration sheet.

This show will abide by the rules and regulations contained in the Society's Affiliated Showing Rules with the exception of:

Rule 5(o) - which is replaced by the definitions for the Driving Championships - C11 to C13 Rule 5(p) - which is replaced by the procedures provided in the notes at the end of the schedule A copy of the Affiliated Showing Rules can be downloaded from the Society website-www.donkeybreedsociety.co.uk. Please ensure you have read these before making your entries for the event as you will be asked to confirm that you have done so.

ARRIVAL TIME

All classes will automatically follow on from the preceding class(es) so please ensure you take this into account in planning your entries and also your arrival time.

DOCUMENTATION AND OTHER CHECKS

Random checks will be made to ensure that all donkeys are fully vaccinated in accordance with the venue rules (see below), are accompanied by their passport, have been micro-chipped and the exhibitor has appropriate public liability insurance cover.

EXHIBITOR NUMBERS

Exhibitor numbers will NOT be posted out but will be available for collection from the Show Office on the morning of the show.

STABLES

Stabling will be available at a cost of £42.00 for an overnight stay and £22.00 for day use, but you must be clear by 17:00 on Saturday. Any exhibitor hiring a stable will be expected to leave it clean and tidy - any fine imposed by the venue will be passed onto that exhibitor. Should a stable not be considered to be clean and tidy on arrival please provide photographic evidence so we may take the matter up with the venue.

VACCINATIONS/PASSPORTS

In accordance with the current vaccine requirements, all horses, ponies and donkeys attending events at the venue must have received at least their first two vaccines. Animals with full programs are advised to have six monthly boosters, however annual boosters are acceptable. All vaccines need to have 7 clear days before attending the event. It is every exhibitor's responsibility to ensure all animals are vaccinated correctly from the start date of their programme. The Society reserve the right to undertake our own random checks and any person being in charge of an animal not being in compliance will both be asked to leave the site. All animals must have passports with them.

ACCOMMODATION

It will be possible to camp or if you come with a caravan there is electric hook up on site provided both are pre-booked, prices on the booking form.

Emailing of Entry Forms, Electronic Payment of Entry Fees and Refund Policy

Completed entry forms may be scanned and emailed to the Show Secretary - donkeybreedsocietytreasurer@gmail.com. Anyone wishing to make their entry in this manner must pay their entry fees electronically and submit a copy of the payment advice. Receipt of the funds will be checked, and a response sent as soon as possible confirming receipt of the entry or requesting further information as necessary.

If you are unable to scan completed entry forms but still wish to pay electronically, please feel free to do so and ensure you enclose a copy of the payment advice along with your entry forms.

In the event the Society is forced to cancel the event all entry fees paid will be refunded in full. Any exhibitor wishing to cancel their entries due to ill health from and including 16th June 2025 will receive a refund, after deducting a £20.00 administration fee, on the production of an appropriate medical certificate from a vet (for the donkey) or a doctor (for the exhibitor).

Definitions/Information for In-Hand Classes

1. Ages

Like all equines, donkeys and mules have an official birthday on 01 January each year so that they are deemed to be a yearling on the 1st January immediately following their birth and a 2-year-old on the following 1st January and so on. For the sake of clarity, the following definitions apply to Seniors and Juniors.

Junior Youngstock (yearling, 2 year olds and 3 year olds) are those born in the period 1st January to 31st May, Senior Youngstock are those born 1st June to 31st December in their birth year.

Junior Foal 01 June to 07 July in the current calendar year

Senior Foal 01 January to 31 May in the current calendar year

Junior Yearling 01 June to 31 December in the previous calendar year

Senior Yearling 01 January to 31 May in the previous calendar year

Junior Gelding Is aged 4 to 9

Junior Stallion Is aged 4 to 9

Junior Barren Mare Is aged 4 to 9

Junior Brood Mare Is aged 5 to 9

Senior Gelding Is aged 10 to 19

Senior Stallion Is aged 10 to 19

Senior Barren Mare Is aged 10 to 19

Senior Brood Mare Is aged 10 to 19

Veteran Aged 20 and over

2. In-Hand Championships

Donkeys who have pre-qualified at affiliated shows during the year together with those qualifying at the National Show In-Hand Classes, on 16 August 2025, as listed in the schedule, will enter the ring wearing their qualifier rosettes. They will parade in the ring as instructed by the judge, who will select the Champion and then the Reserve Champion.

3. Youngstock and Supreme Championships

The Champion donkeys from the In-Hand championship, together with their reserve champion will enter the ring and line up, with the reserves behind the champion. The judge will select the Champion from the first row, their reserve will move forward, and the judge will select the reserve champion from the new first row.

4. Progeny Points Awards

Points are awarded to the sire / dam where eligible, and the highest scoring sire will win the Stallion Progeny Points Award, while the highest scoring dam will win the Mare Progeny Points Award. Points will be awarded in the In-Hand classes at the Championship show and from prequalified donkeys who are not forward at this show. The parent of the pre-qualified progeny will be awarded 6 points for each pre-qualified donkey, but those donkeys will not be eligible for inhand class points. For non- pre-qualified donkeys who enter the In-Hand Classes the following are points are awarded to the parents of the progeny as follows; 6 for 1st, 5 for 2nd, 4 for 3rd, 3 for 4th 2 for 5th and 1 for 6th. In addition, there will be 4 points for each parent of the Individual Champions and a further 2 points for the parents of the Reserve Champions. There are 4 points for each parent of the DBS British Supreme Champion and 2 points for the parents of the DBS British Reserve Champion. Those donkeys registered in the Stud Book as well as those entered in other appropriate DBS registers are eligible for the awards. The winning mare and stallion must be owned on the date of the show by a fully paid-up member of the society. If the winning donkey(s) are deceased the award will still be made. If the owner(s) of the winning donkey(s) are deceased the Society shall retain the trophy(s) for that year. As the results cannot be ascertained until after the show the trophies will be presented at the Society Annual General Meeting. In the event of a tie all winners will hold the trophy(s) for equal periods.

Additional Information for Driving Classes

5. Best Whip Class

The vehicle and harness, providing they are safe, will not be taken into account in the judging. Judging will be based entirely on the whips ability to drive correctly in the traditional English manner.

6. Stubbings Trophy

Points will be awarded to entrants with any disability, driving a suitable vehicle or a vehicle purpose built to carry a wheelchair. The vehicle is to be driven in the traditional English style or the driver is to use reins with any necessary adaptations. The whip may be accompanied by an able-bodied companion. The points will be awarded as follows for each position in each class - 6 for 1st, 5 for 2nd, 4 for 3rd, 3 for 4th, 2 for 5th and 1 for 6th. The trophy will be awarded to the entrant with the highest total score. In the event of a tie the trophy will be shared on a time basis. Eligible entrants must mark their entry forms with a large "D" in the top right-hand corner.

STOP PRESS

Performance Award

There will be an overall donkey winner from those entered at this show. Points will be accumulated in all classes (with the exception of any of the Championships) and the donkey with the most points will be awarded the trophy.

Donkeys will be awarded 6 points for a first place down to 1 point for a sixth place in every class entered.

The more classes entered the more chance your donkey has of winning this award; however please do not over-extend your donkey, their welfare is paramount.

National Showing Points can be accrued at all class levels held at this event. The only exception being the Championship classes.
